While Idaho's Administrative Procedure Act permits the filing of petitions for declaratory rulings regarding the applicability of any order issued by an agency, by the express terms of the governing statute, such petition must be made to the agency itself. See Idaho Code §67-5250(1)("Any person may petition an agency for a declaratory ruling as to the applicability of any order issued by the agency.")(emphases added). The statute does not authorize direct filing with OAH in seeking such declaratory ruling. Instead, a petition for a declaratory ruling must be filed directly with the agency from which a declaratory ruling is sought, at which time the agency can determine (if not otherwise set by statute or regulation) who to assign as the presiding officer for determination of the petition.

Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that OAH declines jurisdiction over

Petitioner's Petition for Declaratory Ruling.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that such Petition for Declaratory Ruling, as filed with OAH, is DISMISSED without prejudice, as Petitioner may still request a declaratory ruling on the subject matter of the Petition for Declaratory Ruling.


